The following excerpts were taken from old newspapers recorded on microfilm at Kettleson Memorial Library.

**September 1862**  
The Alaskan reports: "Miss Sammill is running under full blast this week. Steam power is in use as the water wheel is undergoing repairs."  
**September 1860**  
The Daily Sentinel reports: "Sitka public school enrollment at the end of the second year of school totaled 1381. Superintendent of Schools T.J. Cole reported, comparing figures by years, in the 1857-58 school year enrollment was 797; in 1858-59 there were 996 enrolled and last year's total was 1052. The increase due to construction and operation of the pulp mill is evident from the figures of the last three years."

## Troopers Say Boat Victims Murdered

KETCHIKAN, Alaska (AP) — Two of four bodies found dead in a burning fishing vessel near Craig were murdered, and may have been killed before the fire started, the Alaska State Troopers said Thursday.  
In a brief news release, the troopers said autopsies had been performed on two of the bodies and positive identifications had been made: The victims were identified as Mark Coulthart and his wife Irene, of Bellingham, Wash.  
"Preliminary indications are that Mark and Irene Coulthart were victims of homicide and possibly may have died prior to the fire," a trooper spokesman said.  
She said the investigation also indicates "possibly an act of arson" caused the 54-foot Inverness to be engulfed in flames Tuesday night as it lay at anchor near small fishing community on Prince Wales Island some 6 miles east of Ketchikan in southeast Alaska.  
Troopers said earlier the bodies they recovered were burned beyond recognition. They were sent to Anchorage for autopsies and identification. Through dental charts, there was no way to know whether any more bodies were hidden from the smoldering hull Thursday, John Coulthart, Mark's father, said Wednesday. People, including his own grandchildren, may have been aboard. Troopers said they believed only eight were on the commercial vessel.
