Fishermen Injured in Explosion

SITKA (AP) — Two crewmen injured when an outboard motor exploded on a fishing boat were reported in stable condition Tuesday at an Anchorage hospital after being evacuated from fishing grounds in the Shelikof Strait by a Coast Guard helicopter, a spokesman said.

Coast Guard spokesman Dan Dewell said the accident happened Monday night on the fishing boat Lady of Good Voyage, a 17-foot trawler.

Terry Bartlett, 25, of Bellingham, Wash., and Victor Paul, 25, of Kodiak, Alaska, were being treated for fractures and burns suffered in the accident, Dewell said.

Armed Man Killed on School Playground

CARTERSVILLE, Ga. (AP) — A man periodically seen lurking near a school he once attended had a bulletproof vest, a knife, an ax, a pistol and 48 rounds of ammunition in him when he attacked two deputies and was shot to death, authorities said.

Alan Robert Bear, 25, who attended kindergarten at Vanevy Elementary School, was killed at the school playground Tuesday after he tried to slay a sheriff's deputy and shot at another, according to Alameda County Sgt. Tom Ostlund.

Bear's parents, who live a block

away, said they saw him with a "history of mental illness," said Ostlund, who said Bear had had a "close contact" with the law.

Suspicious teachers, who reported seeing Bear lurking near the school on several occasions since Christmas, summoned officers before school started for the day.

Bear, dressed shabbily in a knitted watch cap, ordinary coat, solid jeans and gardening gloves, was sitting at a picnic table in the playground when Deputy John Piantino arrived, Ostlund said.

Piantino asked Bear to identify himself, but Bear rose from the table, started to stink away and then spun around, swinging a hunting knife.

He stabbed Piantino's chest with the knife, but the deputy was wearing a bulletproof vest that deflected the blade, Ostlund said.

"Some people — one of them a garbage man — went to help Piantino, but Bear started to run," Ostlund said.

Piantino was down with a twisted knee and Bear was running when Deputy Dan McCallister arrived in a patrol car, opened the door and aiming for Bear to halt, Ostlund said.

Bear turned and fired two shots from a .44-caliber pistol, blowing out a car window with one shot and missing McCallister by inches with another that lodged in the driver's seat, Ostlund said.

McCallister then fired, killing Bear with a .357-caliber Magnum bullet, but Bear rose and asked him to roll over so they could handcuff him.

"He said, 'I've had a bad day, officers said. The shooting took place minutes before the 300 students began arriving, Ostlund said. The school, which includes kindergarten through sixth-grade, is in a residential area about 20 miles east of San Francisco.

Probe of Boat Killings Moves to Washington

BELLINGHAM, Wash. (AP) — The investigation into the 1983 mass slaying aboard the purse seiner boat Invester at Craig, Alaska, has switched again to the U.S. Justice Dept.

Sgt. James Stogdill, leader of four Alaska State Troopers who arrived Monday, said the visit was also designed to reassure the victims' families and the public that time has not diminished their commitment to solve one of the worst crimes in Alaskan history.

"We're not sitting up. That's why we're here," said Stogdill.

His efforts on this visit include interviewing and re-interviewing people in hopes of pinning down more precisely the movements of certain people at specific times, Stogdill said.

Because the boat's skipper and six other victims were from Whittier County, his area has been as much a center for the manhunt as the town of Craig off the Alaskan peninsula, he said.

Killed in the September 1982 incident were investor owner and skipper Mark Coulter of Bellingham, his wife, their daughter and two crewmen. The Coulter's 10-year-old son is also presumed to have died, although his remains were never found in the boat's wreckage after it was burned, apparently by arson.

Other officers were believed to be aboard the boat but were never identified as being among the remains.

At the last hearing, Stogdill said, although there have been 12 to 15 troopers working on it at various points, Stogdill said, Stogdill alone has obtained written statements from at least 300 people and has interviewed more than 100 others, he said.

"With the exception of one brief case, I've done nothing but work on the Invester since the crime," Stogdill said.

The trooper said the killer could be either an Alaskan or from Washington, although it is not believed that anyone from Washington journeyed to Alaska specifically to commit the crime.

Unions Rap Sheffield On Stand on Labor

ANCHORAGE (AP) — Labor unions thought they had a friend in Democratic Gov. Welford, but now they're not so sure.

At a news conference Monday, the leaders of about 15 local labor unions gathered to protest the state's stance in negotiations with community college teachers, and the use of inmate labor in renovating abandoned facilities and jails.

We asked for money and fairness," said Jack Pelton, president of the Alaska Building Trades Council.

"That's not happening."

Carl Frasier, former head of the Alaska Federation of Teachers, recalled recommending to his union boys years ago that it endorse Sheffield. He said he wouldn't make the same recommendation today given the case.

governor's "lack of concern with orthodox and honest negotiations with all the unions."

The community college teachers have voted 100 to 20 to seek permission to strike. Laura Kelly, statewide president of the union, said that the labor relation board has ruled the university has committed unfair labor practices six times during 15 months of negotiations.

The university is a lawbreaker," Pelton said. "It has threatened part-time and full-time faculty members with being fired. We will not support any bonding or funding for the university until it learns to obey the law."

Sheffield's deputy press secretary, John Greely, said the administration has had informal discussions with both sides to try to avert a strike. "But we cannot force the board of regents to accept various points of negotiation," he said.

"We think it is reasonable public policy to put inmates to work and save money," Greely said. "We've made the decision to use convicts to work on the Whittier and some jail jobs. "We in no way envision inmates for any major construction projects."
