

Anchorage Schools Seek \$200 Million

ANCHORAGE (AP) — The Anchorage School District wants the state Legislature to fund more than \$200 million in school construction and improvements during the next school year, according to a school district document released Friday.

In its capital improvement project plan, the district is requesting about \$27 million for 13 high-priority projects to handle a classroom shortage that is expected to worsen next year with an estimated increase of more than 1,400 pupils.

No Rush Made for Auto Insurance?
